Water From His Side: Death and Resurrection

Water...Water...Water...Unseen drought and water scarcity in the last 125 years in India! Cauvery Delta has become a cursed area of dry land.. sudden death and suicides of farmers... families in tears and frustration... farmers threatened by loan-givers, pushed to shame and disgrace... Insensitive rulers who are prepared to sell water-resources to multinational companies depriving the native poor of their right to have access to water... still pathetic the Church, the Body of Christ, especially the Urban and institution-filled Church considers this problem as the problem not pertaining to it...No water...thirst, thirst... everywhere. Land is thirsty, animals domestic and wild are thirsty... and this Good Friday, the Church once again preaches on the last words of Jesus on the cross, 'I THIRST.'

It is very simple to give a spiritual explanation for the words of Jesus, I Thirst. His thirst was for the Kingdom which would imply a community built on brotherhood, fellowship and unity. Sensitivity is the basic aptitude lying below these humanitarian values. Is it possible for us to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Jesus while a part of this mystical body is moving

towards abandonment, alienation and death? Jesus could rise again and resurrection was possible for Him, as He was able to relive the abandonment of the poor Israelite, "Why did you abandon me?" Identification with the poor, reliving the miseries of the miserable, undergoing the atrocities of the unjust along with those who were persecuted for the sake of justice... were the unmistakable means of His exaltation....He could be exalted to the right hand of the Father only because he was at the right and left of other crucified men! The piercing of His side with the flow of water and blood was the last means of satisfying His thirst for God's kingdom here on earth.

During Lent, during Holy Week, and especially on Good Friday, are we going to thirst ... thirst for identification with those who are thirsty, literally begging for sustenance, food, water ...to live a few more years on this earth. Can we be satisfied with the streams of water gushing from His side while we are not prepared to spare our fellow-men, the members of the mystical body of Christ, to quench their thirst? It is time for us to think what we must do collectively and individually for these thirsty parts of humankind if only we would celebrate the joy of the gushing waters...the Resurrection!

Blessed Clare Bosatta, DSMP By Fr. Joseph Rinaldo, SdC

Blessed Clare Bosatta was beatified by St. John Paul II on April 21, 1991. On April 20th we celebrate her feast day. Twenty-six years ago we were delightedly surprised by the Holy Father's decision to beatify our Sister Clare. In expectation of the celebration of the event we lived intensely a period of great enthusiasm in order to acquire a deeper knowledge of our Sister's holiness and, as from the day of her beatification, we have certainly experienced her protection as well as her encouragement to deepen our knowledge of her message and to imitate her example.

As the years have passed, she has become ever more familiar to us and has enabled us to better understand the holiness and spirituality of St. Louis Guanella. Indeed, we might say that her beatification gave a further impetus to promoting our Founder's canonization. There is no doubt that Blessed Clare contributed with her prayers from heaven to ensure that Fr. Guanella was declared a Saint. We know that Blessed Clare had a crucial influence on the Founder's journey to sainthood. Still today, those who kneel before their urns at the Shrine of the Sacred Heart in Como cannot but receive that holy incentive to integrate hard-working charity with the contemplation of the sources from which the grace of our activity comes. May the memory of Sr. Clare's beatification revive in all of us gratitude to the Lord for our holy origins. Faithfulness to living their spirit and putting it into practice will increase our faith and love.

Walking towards holiness together, as Fr. Guanella, Sr. Clare and all the good people of God did will reinforce communion and collaboration among the people of God. We also want to renew our commitment of spreading the devotion to Blessed Clare and to ask our Blessed for her intercession so that her holiness may be proposed to the entire Christian world with her canonization. St. Louis Guanella loved Sr. Clare. In the beginning he was puzzled by Sr. Clare's religious life style. He had an inspiration that

Sr. Clare was a mystic. Fr. Guanella was moved to intensely study the works of St. Theresa of Avila. From then on, he understood that Sr. Clare was a saint and a mystic. She was the "little flower" of Guanellian spirituality.

Fr. Guanella wrote a biography of Blessed Clare. It is available at the St Louis Center upon request.

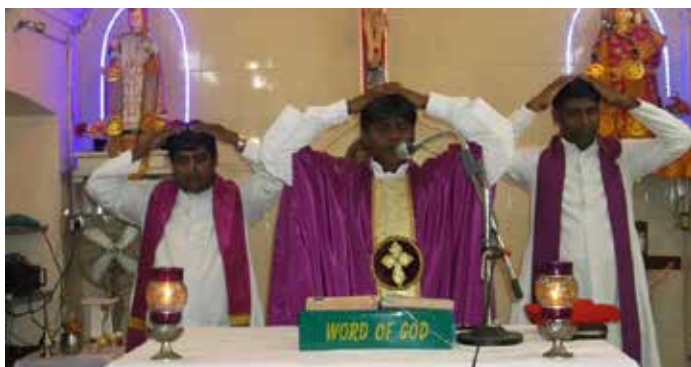
Prayer for the Intercession of Blessed Clare Bosatta

It was inaugurated on March 19th, the feast day of St. Joseph, who is also the foster father of all poor and abandoned children. The objective of the oratory is "Intelligence and Morality". Around 40



children were present at the inauguration. It was a blessed moment for all of us to sense the ministry of Jesus met through the footsteps of St. Louis Guanella and his servants.

Recollection for Guanellian Cooperators

BANGALORE - One's soul is nourished through spiritual formation, serving the poor with love and compassion. A first recollection was organized for our Cooperators on March 11-12th,

building the group spiritually and providing an opportunity for everyone to get to know one other. The event was led by Fr. Prakash and Fr. Adaikalam. Fr.



Prakash led the group with the theme, "The Aimed & Expected Purpose of a Guanellian". He emphasized that our Founder considered relationships very important and always respected the feeling which is "Love". He took this from scripture, where he adored the love of Abba Father, and always loved everyone. Fr. Prakash took the parable from John 15:1-17 "The Vine and the Branches" and explained how we need to stay connected to God down to the roots, so that we will bear fruit. The Cooperators meditated on each verse

in the Guanellian Way and reflected on how Father Guanella would have responded. Fr. Adaikalam then emphasized the formation to help each Cooperator see God in everything. The day concluded with a talk by Fr. Gnanaraj who spoke of the Paternity of God. As a Cooperator, the life of every individual must be based on spirituality and moral values.

The Art of Good Communication

CUDDALORE - Skillful communication is a gift from God that graces the act of announcing His loving message effectively. To excel in the fluency of communication, the young scholastics from St. Joseph's seminary created several programs for developing their oratory skills. This included competition on seminar presentation,



extempore, Gospel sharing, essay writing and a mini-parliament on current events. The seminarians were shuffled in different groups, and guided to demonstrate their talents. In every case, the

brothers provided stunning performances resulting in the audience being wonder struck. It was a beautiful moment of learning for all.

Mission Experience

THALAVADI - Lent is a time when everyone makes an effort to grow in spirituality. This year, the Guanellian Lay Movement (GLM) and Guanellian Cooperators (GC) from Bangalore went on a mission experience to Thalavadi to serve intellectually and developmentally disabled patients (I/DD). It was a two day program aimed at Good



Samaritan work. On the first day, the members received an orientation from Fr. Lawrence,

the Director of the mission house. The members were amazed to learn how our Fathers, Brothers and helpers can take this mission forward with great compassion. We also learned that some patients were transformed

and returned home. Several homes catering to these patients chain them and at times treat them harshly. This was not the case here. Fr. Lawrence and Fr. Ligori told us we only give them love and dignity, and it is God who leads us all in what we do. This was a wonderful lesson learned as a Guanellian. We organized ourselves to get closer to these patients and share their stories. The members actively participated in the residents' physical activity and we entertained them in the evening with music and dance. The following day the members cooked two sumptuous meals. The Community accommodated us with great care and we appreciate their hospitality.

Journey on the Mountain

THALAVADI - The point of Lent is to have a reoriented life towards God. This reorientation is more powerful when it is done with desert and wilderness. This is what the community experienced in the Lenten journey.



The Nazareth Illam community joined the Lenten spiritual journey that was arranged by one of the parishes in the Thalavadi vicariate. Fr. Lawrence, Fr. Gabriel, Bro.

Arun, Bro. Arul Claret OMI, staff and residents participated in the journey with full devotion. They climbed the mountain top which is about a 5 km journey, by reciting the rosary and praying the Way of the Cross. Other faithful from different parishes also took part in this Lenten journey. All classes of people prayed piously and walked through the jungle, thorn and bushes, showing a thirst for God and the unity of people. After climbing to the top of the hill, the gathering celebrated the sacrament of reconciliation and continued the Holy Eucharistic celebration that was a beautiful experience of God's mercy and His presence. Afterwards the village people provided lunch to all the faithful. This Lenten journey helped them to experience the re-LENT-less love of God.

Healing the Inner Self

BANGALORE - We are products of our childhood experiences and knowledge, and any deep childhood negative experience affects our growth and everyday lifestyle. It is possible to be healed by means of

psychological therapies. Six of the novices attended an eight-day Inner Healing session

conducted by Sr. Mary Lyn, an experienced and renowned therapist.



She instructed the novices about how negative, unpleasant experiences can bring psychic wounds to an individual. One's personality, thinking pattern and character is formed by past experiences. She facilitated the novices to share their own stories confidently and dealt with them in a group. Everyone's sharing brought understanding to the other with more love and clarity. Several exercises and workshops were held to deal with different issues experienced by individuals. This session created self-awareness and self-confidence; along with a healing of hurts, forgiveness and a newness of self. Submitting oneself to God in prayer helped the novices to embrace their past with optimism and gratitude. The novices felt an ultimate change in their disposition towards their companions. There was also individual therapy conducted for those who were in need. The professional and affectionate personality of the therapist added color and vigor to the fruitfulness of the sessions.

Youth as Missionaries of Mercy

CUDDALORE - Youth can provide us with an



opportunity to grow as a person. It is a season of hope, enterprise and energy toward society as well as to an individual. The thirteen young Guanellians of Sahaya Matha parish, Samupillai Nagar, along with senior members visited the Global Institute for Mentally Challenged Children for a Lenten program on March 12th. It was a wonderful experience for our group, and

provided them with a wake-up call. Various games warmed up the atmosphere; tea and snacks sweetened up the discounted; dance cheered up the discouraged, and storytelling caused the distressed to look-up. At the end, the team provided the teaching aids for the institute. The legion of Mary also visited the deaf and dumb school as their Lenten program for March 20th.

Parish Offers Day Care Center

CUDDALORE - Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish has a Day Care Center where six students gather daily for rehab. To enhance this ministry of love, many other groups join as one family with spiritual and material assistance. These groups include the Franciscan movement, the St. Vincent de Paul movement and Sahothara Vazhvu Sangam, who helps the mission with greater kindness and love. One example is their timely support for a student named Daniel, who was suffering from an accident. Their deeds of kindness, words of love and material help supported him in his suffering. The Center also acknowledged Rev. Fr. Visuwasam, SdC.,



for arranging the tailoring class for the students. As a part of their training, they sewed bags for the catechism children to carry their rosaries and prayer books.

Lenten Pilgrimage

CUDDALORE - God may not give us an easy journey to the Promised Land but he will give us a safe one. Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish arranged a Lenten pilgrimage on March 26th. Fourteen churches arranged to mediate on the way Jesus chose to redeem the universe. One hundred people gathered on two buses and traveled to three different dioceses. Special prayers were said for the Church, construction of a new church, our congregations, and the faithful. Reflections were made at each station to help the people understand that life passes by very quickly, and that they ought to think more of how to love than how to live.

MANILA - The Carmelite missionaries hosted this year's communion event which was held March 8th at



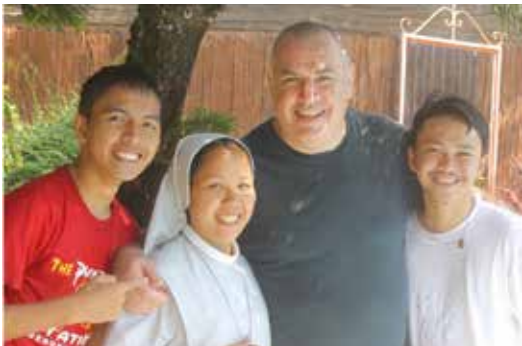
the Carmelite Missionaries Convent. Communio is celebrated every single year to foster camaraderie and tighten the bond between our

CHELSEA - Fr. Enzo Addari, SdC., Executive Director of SLC, has announced the hiring of a new Chief Operating Officer (COO), effective March 1, 2017.

“Ms. Deana Fisher has been hired as our new COO to assist us in strengthening services to our residents as we continue to evolve into the 21st Century as an organization.” According to Fisher, the potential new growth of SLC is what attracted her to Chelsea.



“This agency is not just in a growth mode, it’s in a let’s take some kind of steroid and explode all over the place mode. That’s what’s so interesting to me. That’s exciting. I’m getting in on the ground level where this agency can make its mark nationally or internationally. Who wouldn’t want to be a part of this?”

After obtaining her MSW, Fisher spent many years gathering vital experience through helping the poor in the City of Detroit. These experiences included working with teen parents, supervising foster care, handling adoptions and mentoring teen parents. “I intentionally worked with as many different types of populations as I could; including the autistic and I/DD populations. In each environment, I came into programs that needed to be modernized and brought up to standards. So watching those programs come together has really been fulfilling.” Fisher accepted the position at SLC because, “I knew the foundation here was a good foundation. The values were in the right place, and the things they were trying to do were headed in the right direction. I’m very excited to be here and I can’t wait to see where we’re going because it’s going to be a wild ride.”

Developmental Disabilities Month

CHELSEA - Michigan Gov. Rick Snyder has declared the month of March as Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month in Michigan, and this is the 30th Anniversary of this event. Governor Snyder’s proclamation states, “During this month, we join with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Developmental Disabilities Council to encourage all citizens to recognize Michigan’s advances concerning persons with disabilities, and also acknowledge that our work to ensure full inclusion, integrated employment and community-based settings are not yet done.”

“Fr. Guanella did not limit himself to merely assisting the poor. He sought them out. He felt convinced that ‘we cannot stop as long as there are poor to be aided and needs for which to provide.’ With untiring commitment he went everywhere to make charity bloom and grow. His goal was to offer a dignified living condition, opening a way for the poor to develop personal potentials. In this way they could enjoy the gifts of life and faith in pursuit of the paths of human and Christian fulfillment.” (Basic Document pp. 44-45). Fr. Enzo Addari, SdC., Executive Director of SLC added, “We are grateful to the State of Michigan for the tremendous support we receive throughout the year, along with our educators and the many others who make the lives of our residents better each day.”
