"Do a Bit of Good Every Day"

- St. Louis Guanella

Dear Confreres,

The month of October, dedicated to the Holy Rosary, is for us a privileged time of prayer, contemplation, and renewal. With Mary, the Mother of Divine Providence, we learn to wage battle against the enemy of our souls, to be builders of peace and reconciliation, and to rediscover the beauty of contemplating God in the simplest realities of daily life.

This month also offers us the grace to celebrate our beloved Founder, Saint Luigi Guanella, whose feast on October 24th invites us to return to the roots of our vocation. His life was a Rosary lived simple beads of and humble acts of goodness, strung together in faith, love, and perseverance, forming a crown for Christ and His poor.

1. "Do a Bit of Good Every Day"

In his *Maxims of Spirit and Method of Action* (1888–1889), Don Guanella gave the first sisters and confreres of the Little House a simple yet demanding principle: "To do some good—for both your soul and your body—there are a few solid principles to keep in mind." This "bit of good" is not about extraordinary achievements or grand projects. It is about fidelity

in the little things: a patient word, a hidden sacrifice, a calm perseverance in duty, a quiet prayer offered for the suffering. Guanella's teaching reminds us that holiness is not built in a day, nor through noise and spectacle, but through love lived consistently in the ordinary realities.

2. The Path of Guanellian Simplicity

Start with Peace: No work of God grows in agitation. Goodness flourishes only in hearts rooted in peace.

Guard Your Imagination: Resist distractions and discouragements; stay anchored in the present moment.

Lead the Heart with Reason: Let faith-enlightened reason guide emotions, so that charity remains steady and wise.

Do Small Things with Great Care: The Kingdom is built on ordinary acts done with extraordinary love.

Work Calmly, with Perseverance: God Himself works patiently—let us imitate His rhythm of life.

Examine Yourself Honestly: Each evening, ask: "Have I been faithful in the little things?" This is not merely a method, but a way of sanctity: to walk humbly, to love tenderly, and to act justly in the simple flow of daily life.

3. The Rosary and Guanella

The Holy Rosary, prayed bead by bead, mystery by mystery, reflects this same spirit. Each Hail Mary is a "small thing" simple words whispered in faith. Yet, together, they form a chain of love that unites heaven and earth. Don Guanella understood that fidelity in the little things both in prayer and in action makes a soul strong against temptation, open to peace, and ready for service. Just as the Rosary is a crown offered to Mary, so too our "daily bit of good" becomes a crown for Christ in the poor and suffering.

4. A Call to Our Communities

Dear Confreres, as we celebrate St. Luigi Guanella's feast, I invite every community to mark this time with:

A renewed devotion to the Rosary: offering it daily for peace in the world, reconciliation in the Church, and fidelity in our vocation. Kindly join with the Church on October 11 along with Pope Leo the XIV and recite the Holy Rosary for world peace.

Community reflection on Guanella's maxims: choose one each day and practice it together.

A concrete act of charity: visit the poor, the sick, or the lonely in your local area; do a "bit of good" together as a sign of our charism.

Celebrate simplicity: organize your feast in a humble but joyful way, emphasizing prayer, fraternity, and service over external demonstration.

5. In Everything Love

Our Founder reminds us that "God does not ask for perfection—He asks for love, patience, and a sincere effort to do good, wherever we are, with whatever we have." let us walk with Mary, hand in hand with Saint Luigi Guanella, learning anew the art of fidelity in little things. May each of our communities be a living Rosary—where every confrere is a bead of prayer, charity, and goodness—forming together a crown of love for the Lord and His people.

Gualdera, North Italy, September 1-21, 2025

rom September 1 to 21, 2025, twenty-three participants from diverse countries and cultures gathered in Gualdera, North Italy, for the Guanellian formation course titled Strong Purposes of Good. This unique experience provided an opportunity to reconnect with the spiritual and charismatic roots of the Guanellian Family. We express our deepest gratitude to the General Councils for inviting all three branches of the Guanellian Family to participate, and to our Provincial Superior, Council, communities, and families who, through sacrifice and support, made this journey possible.

The course was divided into three thematic weeks designed to deepen our understanding of who we are as Guanellians today, why and how we serve, and with whom we collaborate. The first week, Being Guanellians Today: Why and How?, invited us to reflect on our identity and mission. The second week, Serving in Today's World: For Whom and Where?, challenged us to consider the realities and needs of the people we serve. The final week, With Whom?, emphasized collaboration among the branches of the Guanellian Family and beyond. Throughout these weeks, the speakers shared their insights with competence, professionalism, and passion, offering not only valuable knowledge but also deep reflections and practical tools for growth. Visits to the places where Don Luigi Guanella lived and worked were particularly inspiring. They allowed us to walk in his footsteps and better understand the social and spiritual context that shaped his life

and charism. These moments helped us rediscover the concrete gestures of God's Fatherhood as lived by Don Guanella—a model for our own daily lives. Reading and reflecting on the Founder's writings during the course led us to view reality through the eyes and heart of the Founder, awakening in us a renewed desire to further explore the lives and teachings of Don Guanella, Sister Chiara, and other Guanellian saints.

This formation experience was rich not only in knowledge but also in life itself. Being together in Gualdera fostered a palpable spirit of family among confreres, sisters, and cooperators from different parts of the world. Sharing testimonies and daily experiences highlighted the vibrancy and diversity of the Guanellian charism in various missions, leaving all participants inspired and deeply connected. These encounters have become a treasure we are eager to share with our local communities and missions.

At the heart of the course was the theme *Strong Purposes of Good*, which we have embraced as a call to live our vocation with renewed commitment. We are joyful to be Guanellians because this charism helps us fully embody our Christian vocation, transforming faith into concrete acts of charity. We are committed to keeping the flame of the charism alive with the certainty that God is a provident and merciful Father. We desire to influence others more by our actions than our words, reflecting God's Fatherhood in patience, compassion, tenderness, humility, kindness, and generosity—especially toward the poorest and most abandoned. With courage, determination, and a prophetic spirit, we follow Don Guanella's invitation to "never stop while there are poor people to help."





Being Guanellians today means living rooted in the charism, practicing charity with open hearts, and collaborating with all to manifest God's Providence in every corner of the world. To live this commitment, we pledge to study the charism to form ourselves and others, engage deeply with the Founder's works, and transmit the Guanellian style—educational and charitable principles inspired by Don Guanella and modeled after Mary's tenderness. We recognize the religious community as a privileged place for the charism's growth, and we strive to live with simplicity and joy wherever we are sent.

We also commit to creating spaces that promote genuine and deep listening, offering our service daily with special attention to those who are most vulnerable. We understand the call to discern new forms of poverty and to serve not only in traditional contexts but wherever we find ourselves—at home, in the community, in the Church, and in the world. Collaboration among the three branches of the Guanellian Family—confreres, sisters, and cooperators—is vital, and we are called to work synodally with the Guanellian Youth Movement, lay members, religious institutions, parishes, public entities, and people of goodwill to maximize the effectiveness of our charitable mission.

Looking ahead, we offer several proposals for the growth and strengthening of our Family. To our local communities, we encourage ongoing formation on the charism, the writings and life of Don Guanella, a rediscovery of communal prayer and Eucharistic adoration, and the fostering of mutual relationships among all branches of the Guanellian Family and collaborators. We also encourage sharing the richness of



formation experiences such as this one. To our major superiors, we propose promoting participation in formation experiences like the one in Gualdera, deepening knowledge of our Guanellian saints as living models, and guiding young people interested in the charism toward nearby communities. For members and superiors of the three branches, it is essential to establish local study centers responsible for organizing formation moments and translating Guanellian texts, to hold regular community meetings for study and planning, and to ensure that Gualdera is not a one-time event but a model for ongoing formation. We also urge outreach to those no longer active through spiritual initiatives such as prayer networks, and we invite all to collaborate in building a charity network that unites the diverse faces of the Guanellian Family, in the spirit of Don Guanella's teaching that "charity never closes its heart."

In summary, this formation course has been a profound and lasting experience for all who participated. We return to our missions with greater knowledge, a deeper love for the charism, and a renewed responsibility to live and share the spirit of Saint Luigi Guanella. We thank Divine Providence for this gift and trust it will continue to guide and sustain us as we journey forward together.


