PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Dear Confreres!

Pope Francis has approved 'Pilgrims of Hope' as the theme for a Jubilee Year to take place in 2025. With ancient roots, a Jubilee in Christian tradition is held every 25 years and invites the faithful to a year of conversion and repentance, a time of reconciliation and justice, a time in which all things that belong to God are returned to God.

The image of a 'pilgrim Church' was brought to the fore at the Second Vatican Council, recalling for the Church its nature as a community of disciples journeying through human history. Through trial and tribulation, the pilgrim people of God orients itself to the fullness of God's kingdom, engages with and sanctifies the concrete realities of its time, and commits itself to a path of ongoing conversion, including penance and renewal, before God until it 'arrives at the light which knows no setting' (Lumen Gentium 8).

The Jubilee theme of 'hope', rather than promoting the Church as a naive society or program for positive thinking, challenges the Church to radical discipleship and outward mission. Living as a person of hope necessitates the courage to commit one's self by a daily response to God as our future. This grace of hope not only comforts us by awakening us to the presence and love of God but also disrupts us by urging us on, to the renewal and conversion that this great love invites.

The hope we have as the baptized by our adoption into Christ and the reception of God's grace in the Eucharist and other sacraments asks something of us. So we not only "hold" hope as it were but are compelled to "live" hope, to embody it in our actions and practical commitments to


love God and our neighbor even when the loving is hard.

We are faced with the reality of a world in which people continually experience moments of darkness, anguish and despair in the face of multiple crises that threaten our existence. Pandemics, wars, insecurity

and social misery are eloquent facts of the desperation of our people in their march towards the fullness of life. Nowadays, the news coming to us from the media and different life experiences often make us look up to heaven and ask, like the psalmist: "Where will help come from?" (Ps. 121)



In this context of multiple existential challenges, the world needs a presence that restores hope, a word that reassures people in their life choices, a witness that sheds light on doubts for more convincing action and commitment. In short, our contemporaries need a pilgrim who is walking with them, a witness and bearer of hope. It is in this journey of the men and women of the world that a Guanellian religious, as a pilgrim with his brothers and sisters, accepts to offer himself as the presence of Christ and of hope. Our congregation, in particular our province as an institution of hope is to reassure them and bear witness to the presence of God in this journey towards full communion with Him.

Pope Francis reminds us of this when he says that "a worldwide tragedy like the Covid-19 pandemic momentarily revived the sense that we are a global community, all in the same boat, where one person's problems are the problems of all. Once more we realized that no one is saved alone; we can only be saved together" (Fratelli Tutti, 32). Human life is a journey, or rather a pilgrimage, to be undertaken as a team with fellow travellers whose presence gives meaning, joy and support in the search for new goals, striving towards the infinite. Walking together on the path of life is a necessity for today's mission. And in a special way for us, it updates and strengthens the importance of his life in community (with a particularly communitarian lifestyle), the awareness of his belonging to the religious family and the Church, to remain in communion for the life and mission of the congregation.

Indeed, being on pilgrimage with others reveals one's desire to participate in the life of the community, communion with the aspirations of each of the pilgrims, sharing one's hopes with others. It is also an expression of one's attitude to welcome and listen to the hopes of others and to carry them together; it is also the will to be part of the community in the making; it is, in fact, being in communion and living synodality. This symbolizes the hope of each pilgrim in the time and space of their existence; but it also imposes on each one the need to define themselves and be aware of who they are on this common journey. As an integral part of the jubilee year for the Church in 2025, the Dicastery for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life (DICLSAL) is inviting the participation of all consecrated men and women in the Jubilee of Consecrated Life to be celebrated in Rome (8-9 October 2025) and nationally in home

countries (2 February 2025). wish you all a good preparation to celebrate the jubilee year and happy feast of our holy founder St. Louis Guanella. May our dear founder continue to intercede for us that we may continue to live and spread the Guanellian charism, spirit and mission!

MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL SUPERIOR

Dear Confreres

Receive my fraternal greeting, may the love of God dwell in our hearts and make us able to live in fraternity and communion. We entered the month of October, this year particularly rich with events of growth for the Church and the Congregation. In the Church, at Rome, the first session of the Synod on synodality is celebrated. A meaningful and delicate passage in the journey of the Church. The Synod is not only entering the pastoral aspect of the Church's life but also in themes touching its very identity. Our prayer to the Holy Spirit is the best way to be part of such an important gathering for the whole Church, for us all as a Church!

The indication of the 21st General Chapter, which I did, in union with the General Council, on October 2nd, is the Feast of the Guardian Angels. Just as the Angels, in God's name, guard our life and keep watch on our journey, so also each one of us is called to keep watch, to live and foster the gift of the Spirit we received: our charism. The General Chapter is actually an event of evaluation and program starting from the charism.

- 1. October 9 is the anniversary of Brother Giovanni Vaccari's birth to heaven. He is one of our home saints. The General Postulator already sent specific indications about the way to live this anniversary and also about the process of canonization, which was concluded in Palencia diocese and has started the first phase at the Dicastery of Saints in Rome. Brother Giovanni is another gift, as an example and exhortation to the more and better offered by God to each one of us. Let us be his heirs, with faith and courage.
- 2. October is the month of our Founder. During this month, over the years, the Church has proclaimed his holiness and the values offered by his life and mission. We are his spiritual sons. It is a grace given by God when He called us to the Congregation of Don Guanella. This work, which was born in the mind and heart of the Heavenly Father, and was offered as a project by the Spirit to Don Guanella, is now entrusted to us. What a responsibility for our life!

The best way to celebrate his feast day and our gratitude to God for the Founder is to take an extra step, to move forward, personally and as a community, in making his spirit and charism shine in our lives. Often the enthusiasm and passion for Don Guanella and his charism appear fading in several confreres, obscured, with little life and attraction. What is happening, dear confreres? We cannot afford such mediocrity. Let's move, roll up our sleeves, and open our hearts to the breath of the Spirit who still wants to accomplish with us, as he did with Don Guanella, miracles of good, growth, holiness, and creative charity. We are always means and co-operators of God in the charity we do! Best wishes to each

and everyone, to the communities, the collaborators in our houses, and the persons we love and serve. May the Founder obtain for us from God liveliness and enthusiasm in living out our charism!

INDICTION OF THE 21ST GENERAL CHAPTER

Dear Confreres,

The time for Chapter is already here!



During these days we are entering the year of preparation to celebrate the 21st General Chapter. We will have the opportunity to recall, give thanks, and pray for all that happened during the past six years, for all we have celebrated, suffered, overcome together, in ways of solidarity and fraternity. We will also see all that we still need to welcome in our hearts and express out, because it is only as shapeless clay, because of our human frailty. During the January meeting of the General Council with the Superiors of Provinces and Delegations, we agreed on some aspects of the celebration of this important event of our Congregations.

- In particular, we chose as theme of our reflection: Faithful and creative in the charism, coresponsible in the mission. With Christ, we take up the challenges of our time!
- The Chapter will begin at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, October 6, 2024 in the Shrine of the Sacred Heart at Como, with the Eucharistic Celebration to invoke the Holy Spirit. After supper, the Chapter members will move to Barza d'Ispra (Va), the seat of the General Chapter of the Servants of Charity.
- As an indication, the closing of the Chapter will be with the Feast of the Founder in the Shrine at Como, Thursday October 24, 2024, but this shall be decided by the Chapter itself.
- The Chapters of Provinces and Vice Province, and the Delegations' Assemblies must be
 celebrated not later than June 2024, so that at the end of that month the convocation of the
 members may take place.
- We will not form a special preparatory Committee, rather the General Council will
 coordinate the preparatory work, involving all the confreres by means of a questionnaire
 about the Congregation.
- We apply again the **following indications**, already used for the past General Chapters:
 - **a)** The percentage to be used to elect the Delegates of each Province to the General Chapter is one Delegate every 20 confreres of perpetual vows (or a fraction over 10) and one Delegate every 40 confreres of temporary vows (or fraction over 20)
 - **b)** The Vice Province "Our Lady of Hope", by way of derogation from the Statutes, will not hold the Assembly of the perpetual confreres but a Vice Province



Chapter, celebrated in analogy with the Provincial Chapters, therefore with the election of the Delegates to the General Chapter.



c) The General Secretary will inform later, giving all the necessary indications for the celebration of the Provincial Chapters and of the General Chapter.
All these taken into account, and having received full consent of the General Council

THE 21ST GENERAL CHAPTER OF THE CONGREGATION OF THE SERVANTS OF CHARITY

May the Holy Spirit enlighten and help us to see the signs of his love in the events of our history. I entrust our effort for a good outcome in the preparation and the execution of the Chapter works to the intercession of Brother Giovanni Vaccari, whose body is buried in the very Chapel where we shall be celebrating the liturgies during the General Chapter. He loved so much the Congregation, may he obtain from the Good Shepherd the necessary assistance to evaluate and plan the life of our Religious Family. I send brotherly greetings to you and to all the members of the large Guanellian Family you will be able to involve in prayer for our important meeting.
